

Larkin Street Youth Services: Overview

Background & Key Facts

- Larkin Street Youth Services was founded in 1984 as a neighborhood effort to help San Francisco's most vulnerable youth – homeless and runaway ages 12-24 – in the Tenderloin and Polk Gulch areas of San Francisco and has served over 70,000 youth since we opened.
- Larkin Street's programs address the immediate needs youth have for housing, food and safety, while also encouraging their participation in essential support services that offer the skills and resources needed to help them reach their full potential and keep them off the streets for good.
- **Today, Larkin Street is an internationally recognized leader providing innovative, effective housing, medical, social and educational services to at-risk, homeless, and runaway youth ages 12-24 across 25 programs and 13 sites throughout San Francisco. Eighty-four percent of Larkin Street's funding goes to the programs.**

Program Highlights

- Larkin Street's Assisted Care program was the nation's first licensed residential care center for HIV positive youth between the ages of 18-25.
- The Lark-Inn for Youth is the only emergency shelter in San Francisco for youth ages 18-24.
- Larkin Street is the leading service provider of comprehensive housing and supportive services to former foster care youth in San Francisco through the LEASE program.
- The Castro Youth Housing Initiative is one of the first and only housing programs in the nation for LGBTQ youth.
- Routz is an innovative housing and intensive support program for youth with severe mental health issues.

Current Outlook: Youth on the Streets

- It is estimated that each year 1.8 – 2.1 million youth are homeless in the United States.
- **In San Francisco alone, an estimated 5,700 youth are homeless and/or marginally housed annually.**
- Of Larkin Street's clients:
 - Many have been physically, sexually or emotionally abused.
 - Nearly half cannot return home.
 - Many suffer from poor health, mental health issues and substance use issues.

Our Results: Keeping Youth Off the Street

- **In 2010, Larkin Street engaged over 3,400 homeless and runaway youth in services and Larkin Street's housing programs kept youth off the streets for 86,190 nights.**
- 109 Hire Up program clients found jobs at an average hourly wage of \$10.70.
- 108 youth re-engaged in education by enrolling at Larkin Street's on-site high school.
- Last year, Larkin Street helped 124 formerly homeless youth enroll in post-secondary education including San Francisco State University, City College of San Francisco, Golden Gate University, Los Angeles City College, Portland State University and Heald College.
- **Last year, 76% of youth who completed Larkin Street's comprehensive programs exited street life.**
